ASYMMETRICAL SNAP SCARF



MATERIALS

- 1 piece of 60"x14" wool**
- 1 piece of 60"x14" quilt weight fabric†
- Scissors or rotary cutter
- Coordinating thread
- 6 heavy duty snaps
- Heavy duty snap tool kit
- Hammer

* Can use another heavy fabric, but it needs to be as stiff as wool to achieve the look of this scarf.

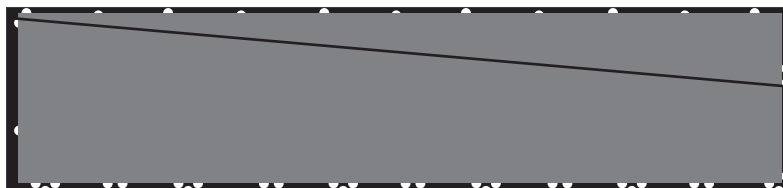
† Both of these pieces of fabric can be patched together from scraps if needed — especially the quilt weight part since that's going to be the inside of your scarf.

DIRECTIONS

- 1 Line up both pieces of fabric with right sides together.

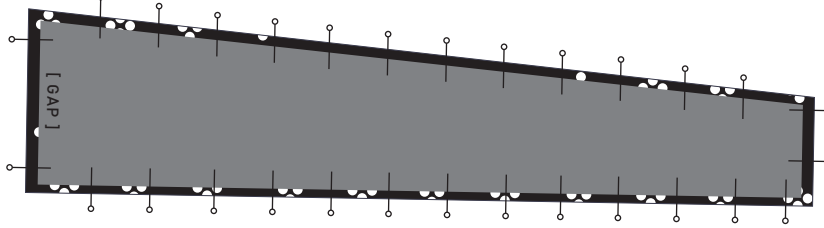


- 2 Make a cut in both pieces of fabric so one end of your scarf is skinnier than the other. Don't cut the end shorter than five inches so you have room for your snaps. I used scissors here because you don't have to be precise.
NOTE: The image below shows two different sizes of fabric. Your fabric pieces should be the same size. I wanted to show the layers of fabric together.

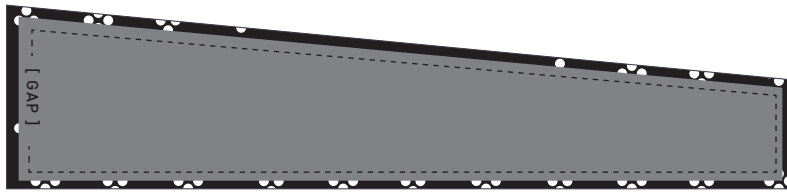

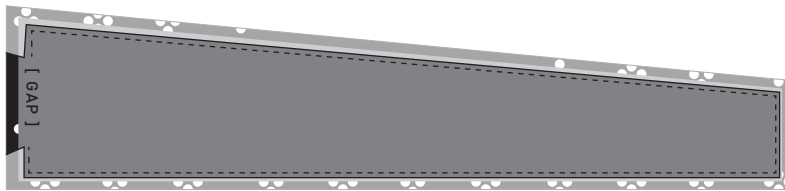
- 3 Pin your fabric together. Leave a gap in the wider end of your scarf so you don't sew it shut.



- 4 Stitch your scarf. Don't sew where you left the gap.



- 5 Trim the extra fabric around the edges so you have 1/8" of fabric next to the seam. Leave the fabric where you left the gap. You'll need that later.



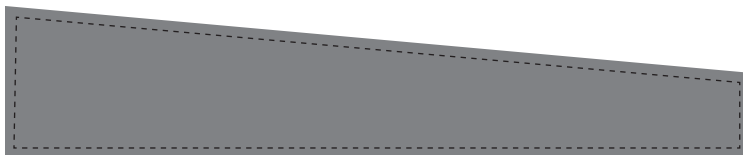
- 6 Turn your scarf. Use a butter knife or chopsticks to help you poke the corners out so they're nice and sharp.



- 7 Iron the scarf. Put the fabric where the gap is inside the scarf so the edge matches up with the rest of the scarf's edge. Iron. Pin shut.

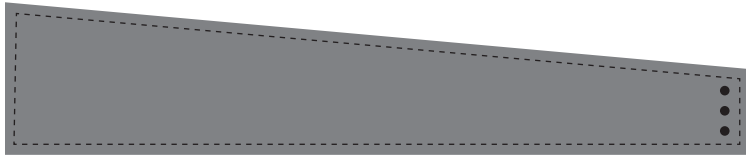


- 8 Sew a 1/4" seam around the scarf. You can be creative and use a decorative stitch here if you would like.

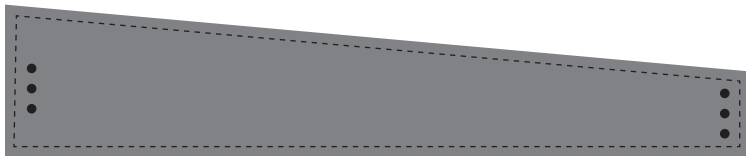

- 9 Figure out where you want your snaps on the short end of your scarf.
Apply following the directions on the snap tool kit (hint: you'll need a hammer).



- 10 Apply the snaps on the wide end of your scarf to match up with the short end.



- 11 Wrap and enjoy! You can wrap many ways. You don't have to snap all the snaps every time or even match the snaps up to each other. Have fun with it!
